The NSS Symbol

The symbol of the National Service Scheme, as appearing on the cover page is based on the chariot wheel of the Konark Sun Temple situated in Odisha. These giant wheels of the Sun Temple portray the cycle of creation, preservation and release, and signify the movement in life across time and space. The design of the symbol, a simplified form of the sun-chariot wheel primarily depicts movement. The wheel signifies the progressive cycle of life. It stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of the NSS for social transformation and advancement.

About the NSS

The National Service Scheme (NSS) had its birth on September 24, 1969, during the Gandhi centenary year. The scheme was first launched in 37 Universities comprising 40,000 students.

Today the NSS has become the largest Government organization of students in the country comprising members from the +2 levels to the college and university level. The strength of volunteers has now increased to more than 30 lakhs, which makes the NSS one of the largest student forces in the world.

The NSS has good relations with different government agencies and non-government organization in implementing its programmes for building up community assets, helping the underprivileged people through education and social services.

The NSS is useful not only for the development of the student’s personality, but it also helps promote the unity and integrity of the nation by bringing together young people from diverse geographical and socio-cultural backgrounds. The National Service Scheme (NSS) started functioning at Jadavpur University since 1969 and the performance of this scheme is highly satisfactory.

Various events were conducted during the past 4 years and quantum of output was received in terms of awareness and services.

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Report on Collection for International White Cane Day

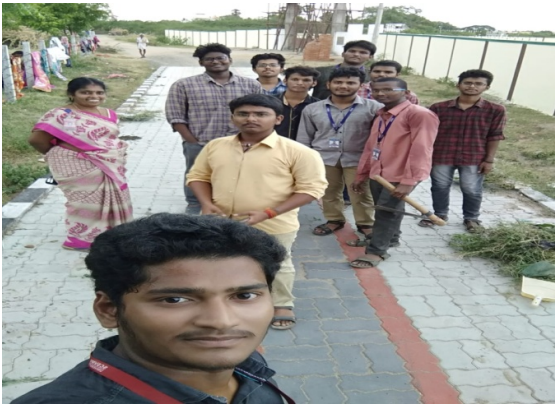
SCSVMV NSS student volunteers were eager to assist blind individuals. They intended to offer and collect donations from SCSVMV students and employees during the second week of April 2018. The registrar of SCSVMV granted official permission to Dr. P.Nagarajan, NSS Programme Coordinator for the event. NSS student volunteers went to each class and explained to the student the significance of "International White Cane Day." They asked all students to put their donations for the blind in a sealed collection box. They also solicited donations from the SCSVMV faculty.

In the presence of our honourable registrar Dr.G.Srinivasu, SCSVMV, the money gathered in the sealed box was opened and counted. The entire money collected was Rs. 4171/-. (Four thousand one hundred and seventy one only). The same amount of rupees 4171/- was sent to the concerned office via courier in the form of DD. It was mailed to Indian Association for the Blind, Higher Secondary School & Rehabilitation Center, Sundarrajan apatty, Arumbanur post, Madurai - 625 104, Tamilnadu. The Programme Officers guided the NSS volunteers collect funds. A total of 20 NSS volunteers participated in this event and completed their duties.

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Report on Summer Internship Programme

The summer internship programme was an initiative programme by NSS regional directorate office. The NSS student volunteers listed below actively engaged in the summer internship programme held in June and July of 2018. They went to Enathur and Adhi Sankarar Nagar, two different places. They have participated in cleaning and plastic collection drive, as well as plastic awareness activities in their local areas. Totally 27 NSS volunteers actively participated in this event.



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Report on Kerala Flood Relief Fund Collection

The NSS's primary goal is to provide volunteer assistance to needy people during disasters. On August 23, 2018, the NSS wing of SCSVMV volunteers gathered contributions for the Kerala flood relief from our SCSVMV students in a sealed box. This activity engaged about 50 students. The NSS students visited each and every class to collect money. The collected amount was Rs. 55,304 (fifty five thousand three hundred and four only) and was counted in front of Dr.T.Venugopal, Controller of Examinations, SCSVMV, and credited to the SCSVMV account for sending the money to the pertinent Kerala government agency via SCSVMV.





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Report on Blood Donation Camp

SCSVMV's NSS wing organises blood donation camps on a regular basis and donates blood units to local government hospitals for the goal of aiding needy underprivileged people.

On August 30, 2018, the SCSVMV NSS wing successfully arranged a blood donation camp. It was held at the Sri Jayandra Saraswathi Medical Centre in collaboration with the Government Primary Health Centre in Parandur and the Government Head Quarters Hospital Blood Bank in Kanchipuram.

Dr.P.Nagarajan, NSS Programme Coordinator, welcomed honourable Vice Chancellor Dr.V.S.Vishnu Potty, Chief Administrative Officer Mr.V.Ramachandran, Doctors, and students to this blood donation camp. The doctors were presented with shawls by the Vice Chancellor. NSS volunteers worked tirelessly to ensure the program's success. One day prior, NSS volunteers went to each class and collected a list of students who were eligible and interested in donating blood. Students gave a total of 110 units of blood, and 150 NSS volunteers participated in this event. Mr.J.Vinoth, NSS Programme Officer, and others organised the programme.

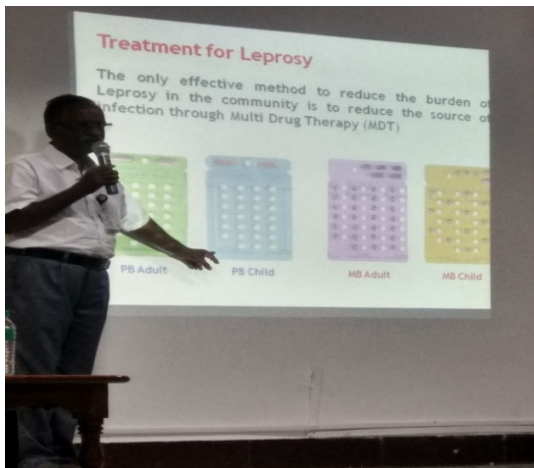


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Report on Health Awareness Programme

Highlights of NSS special Camp 2018-19

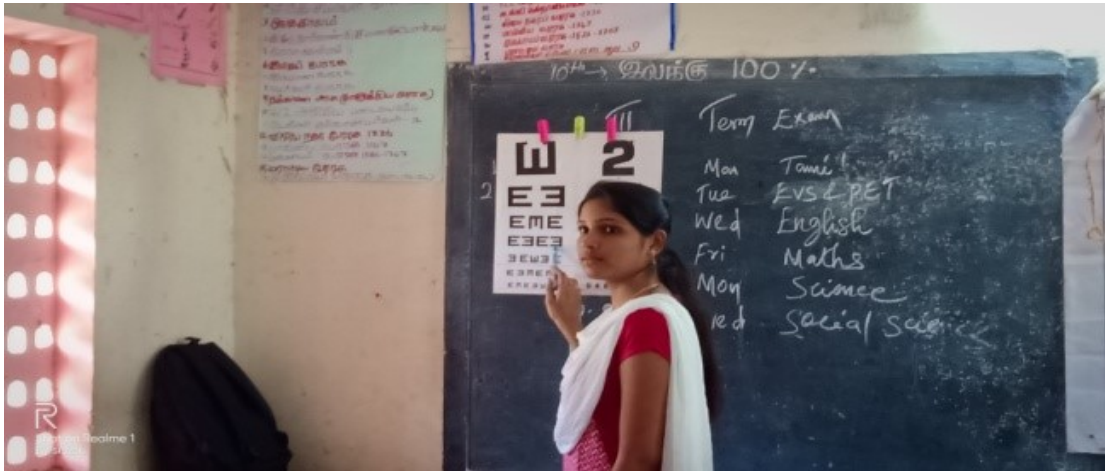
