### **Programme Vision and Objectives**

### **Eligibility Criteria for admission to M.A., Sanskrit**

The candidate seeking admission to M.A should have passed in Sastri/B.A in Sanskrit of a recognized university or any bachelor's degree with working knowledge in Sanskrit (10 + 2 + 3 pattern).

### **Scheme of Examination**

#### **i. Internal**

Internal marks (30) will be awarded to candidates after assessing them in online tests/home assignments, and Attendance.

#### **ii. External**

External examinations will be for 100 marks. What the students score will be converted to 70 and this will be combined with their score in Internal Examinations.

### **Pattern of Question paper:**

There shall be three Parts – A, B & C in the Question paper. Part A shall contain 15 questions out of which the candidate has to answer all 15 questions in a few sentences each. Each question carries 2 marks totalling  $15 \times 2 = 30$ . Part B shall contain 8 questions out of which 5 has to be answered. Each question shall carry 6 marks each totalling  $(5 \times 6 = 30)$ . Part C shall contain 4 questions, out of which 2 has to be answered each question carrying 20 marks totalling  $(2 \times 20 = 40)$

### **Minimum marks for a pass**

A Candidate has to secure 50% comprising Internal Assessment and External Examinations. The minimum score for a pass is 15/30 in Internal Examinations and 50/100 (35/70) in the External Examinations. In case of failure in any paper, the candidate has to reappear for that paper only.

### **Requirement of the Library Resources**

Our University has an international library available to all the students under ODL mode and the working time is 8 AM to 8 PM.

#### Duration of the programme

The duration of the M.A. Sanskrit under ODL mode is for two years. However, the learners are required to complete the course within 4 years from the date of admission.

The semester pattern was introduced in Sri Chandrasekharendra Saraswathi Viswa Mahavidyala and shall be followed. The programme shall be delivered in six semesters. The learners will be provided with the printed SLM which covers almost all the contents in the syllabus. Counselling classes will be held at the headquarters (university premises) only. The progress of the learners shall be evaluated by Internal Assessment and Semester End examination. Examinations will be conducted as per the rules and regulations adopted by Sri Chandrasekharendra Saraswathi Viswa Mahavidyalaya. The materials are prepared in the following formats: Print Media, ICT based content, content delivered through e-learning portal.
