PRELUDE

The name Kanchipuram is derived from two Sanskrit words – “Kanchi” meaning “Brahma worship” and “-puram” denoting a “residential place.” With a rich legacy dating back centuries, Kanchipuram has been a distinguished Ghatikasthanam – a “Seat of Learning” – attracting scholars from across regions.

It was in this sacred and historically significant place that Sri Chandrasekharendra Saraswathi Viswa Mahavidyalaya (SCSVMV), popularly known as Kanchi University, was established in 1993. The foundation of the University was a part of the centenary celebrations of His Holiness Sri Chandrasekharendra Saraswathi Mahaswamigal, the revered 68th Acharya of the Kanchi Kamakoti Peetam.

The initiative was conceived to revive and sustain Kanchipuram’s ancient glory as a seat of holistic learning – blending India’s cultural heritage with the demands of modern education. This noble vision was nurtured under the guidance and blessings of Their Holiness Shri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetadhipatis Jagadguru Pujyasri Jayendra Saraswathi Shankaracharya Swamigal and Pujyasri Sankara Vijayendra Saraswathi Shankaracharya Swamigal, fulfilling the Paramacharya’s cherished aspiration.

Founding Milestones

The University’s origins trace back to the Sri Chandrasekharendra Saraswathi Nyaya Sastra Mahavidyalaya, established in the late 1970s, offering specialized Sanskrit programs in rare academic disciplines at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels, affiliated to the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi.

In 1983, the institution applied to the Ministry of Education & Culture, Government of India, for inclusion in the Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya / Sodh Sansthan Scheme. Following a screening committee’s visit in February 1983 and subsequent recommendations, official approval was granted in late 1984.

To further the vision of the Paramacharya, the Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetam Charitable Trust was formed and registered in 1987, providing the institutional framework for the University's future growth.

Institutional Growth

Since its formal inception in 1993, SCSVMV has evolved into a multidisciplinary institution, offering academic programs across Sanskrit and traditional studies, as well as contemporary domains such as engineering, science, commerce, management, and humanities.

Guided by its founding ideals, the University strives to harmonize academic excellence with cultural enrichment and ethical grounding – preparing students to contribute meaningfully to society while upholding the values of India's educational heritage.

Recognition as a Deemed-to-be University


In keeping with its vision for academic expansion and excellence, the Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetam Charitable Trust formally submitted a proposal to the University Grants Commission (UGC) seeking the conferment of Deemed-to-be University status for the institution. Following a comprehensive inspection and a detailed evaluation by a committee constituted by the UGC, the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, conferred the status of Deemed-to-be University through Notification No. F-9-9/92-U.3 dated 26th May 1993.

The University commenced its academic journey with Sanskrit as its inaugural programme, thereby reaffirming its deep-rooted commitment to the preservation and promotion of India's classical knowledge systems. In 1995, the academic portfolio expanded with the establishment of an Ayurveda Medical College, marking a significant step towards integrating traditional systems of medicine into mainstream higher education.

Since inception, the University has remained steadfast in its mission to deliver quality education with a strong value-based orientation, ensuring accessibility through a comparably low fee structure—particularly aimed at benefiting students from economically disadvantaged and middle-income backgrounds.

With the continued patronage and blessings of its revered Patron Saints Jagadguru Shankaracharya Swamigals of Shri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetam, the University is poised to scale greater heights in the years ahead, striving towards academic distinction while upholding its core values of inclusivity, cultural preservation, and holistic development.




Jagadguru Kanchi Mahaswamiji's Message on Education







Activities of the Committee during the year 2024-2025

7. Mime on Gender Equality



- Importance of gender sensitivity on campus


