45.5.2 Implementation of Question Bank Systems

Proposed by: Prof. Konda Srinivasa Rao, Controller of Examinations in-charge

Seconded by: Dr. Debajyoti Jena, HoD i/c - Sanskrit & Indian Culture

The proposal to prepare a Question Bank for each course of every program across all departments, with the active involvement of the respective faculty members and external subject experts was placed with key points, before the Council.

The members held detailed discussions on the above. Thereafter the Council approved the proposal with the proposed features and incorporating additional points as suggested collectively by the members and unanimously passed the following resolution

“RESOLVED THAT the proposal of Question Bank System, be and is hereby approved for implementation with immediate effect, with the salient points enumerated hereunder: -

- 1. The questions from each unit shall be prepared in accordance with the Bloom’s Taxonomy nomenclature and its respective cognitive levels.**
- 2. Questions drawn meet the Programme Objectives and Outcomes of the course.**
- 3. Upon completion, the Question Bank shall be scrutinized by an External Subject Expert to ensure quality and compliance.**
- 4. Questions should span all difficulty levels (Easy, Medium and Difficult) and each question be marked with its difficulty level. At least 21 short answer questions (7 easy, 7 medium and 7 difficult) and 21 essay answer questions (7 easy, 7 medium and 7 difficult) from every unit, ensuring coverage of all topics in the unit.**
- 5. A course with five units, a total of at least 105 short answer questions and 105 essay-type questions will be available. This is more than 10 times the actual number of questions required for any examination.**
- 6. The question papers will be generated using in-house software and subsequently scrutinized either by the External Expert or the Head of the Department.**
- 7. Faculty members shall not confine their classroom teaching to the Question Bank alone. They are expected to ensure comprehensive coverage of all topics prescribed in the syllabus to promote a deeper understanding of the subject among students.**
- 8. The question paper generated by the software from the Question Bank shall consist of 40% easy-type questions, 40% medium-type questions, and 20% difficult-type questions, based on the total marks of the respective subject.**
- 9. The Question Bank shall be used only for generation of Question Papers internally and the same shall not be shared with the Students and/or Faculty.”**
